President's Report 2015-2016

I am very pleased to present the 64th annual President's Report for the Rotary Club of Kiama, District 9675. The Club has continued its great tradition of supporting many community projects, through members' enthusiasm, participation and camaraderie. Key milestones and accomplishments are detailed later in this report.

The International President Ravi Ravindran's theme for the year was "Be a Gift to the World" and we were encouraged to bring our gifts and talents to our Clubs and District. I believe we have worked hard as a club and, through our individual and collective talents, have contributed to the wellbeing of our local, national and international communities.

Of particular note this year was the instigation of a joint venture with Gerringong Sunrise Rotary Club and Australian Rotary Health to raise \$5,500 per annum from each club for three years to fund a melanoma research project.

The Cancer Council of Australia reports that melanoma is the fourth most common cancer diagnosed in Australia, which along with New Zealand has the world's highest incidence rate. To undertake the research, Sheena Daignault, a PhD student from the University of Queensland was selected from a number of outstanding applicants. It is hoped Sheena will have an opportunity to visit us some time in the future.

Proceeds from the Clubs' annual Car Spectacular were pledged to the melanoma research project and at this year's event, two local Doctors also provided free melanoma skin checks for attendees, a number of which were referred for further medical tests.

Our profile has been promoted locally through regular contributions to the Kiama Independent and Bugle newspapers and we have reached out more widely through a Facebook Page and our new website. Our weekly Bulletin continues to be an exceptional communication tool for our members.

A major local project for us this year celebrates the 50th Anniversary of the construction of the Club's original Saddleback Mountain Lookout. The project involves the repair and refurbishment of the Saddleback Mountain Southern Lookout, including improved access and visibility with a gravel path through the rainforest, properly constructed steps where required and a timber viewing platform to enhance the attraction of the reserve to locals and visitors. The project was initiated and developed by the Rotary Club of Kiama in association with the Kiama Municipal Council. With the assistance of our local member Gareth Ward, we were successful in obtaining a Community Building Partnership Grant of \$50,000 to enable this work to proceed.

The project is now underway and is due for completion by March 2017.

In closing I would like to particularly thank Treasurer Trevor and Secretary Geoff for their considerable commitment and the other members of the Board, along with all the Kiama Rotarians, for your support, encouragement and friendship. I feel sure that you will continue to share your gifts and talents with incoming President Dave Chambers and I wish him a fulfilling and successful year.
